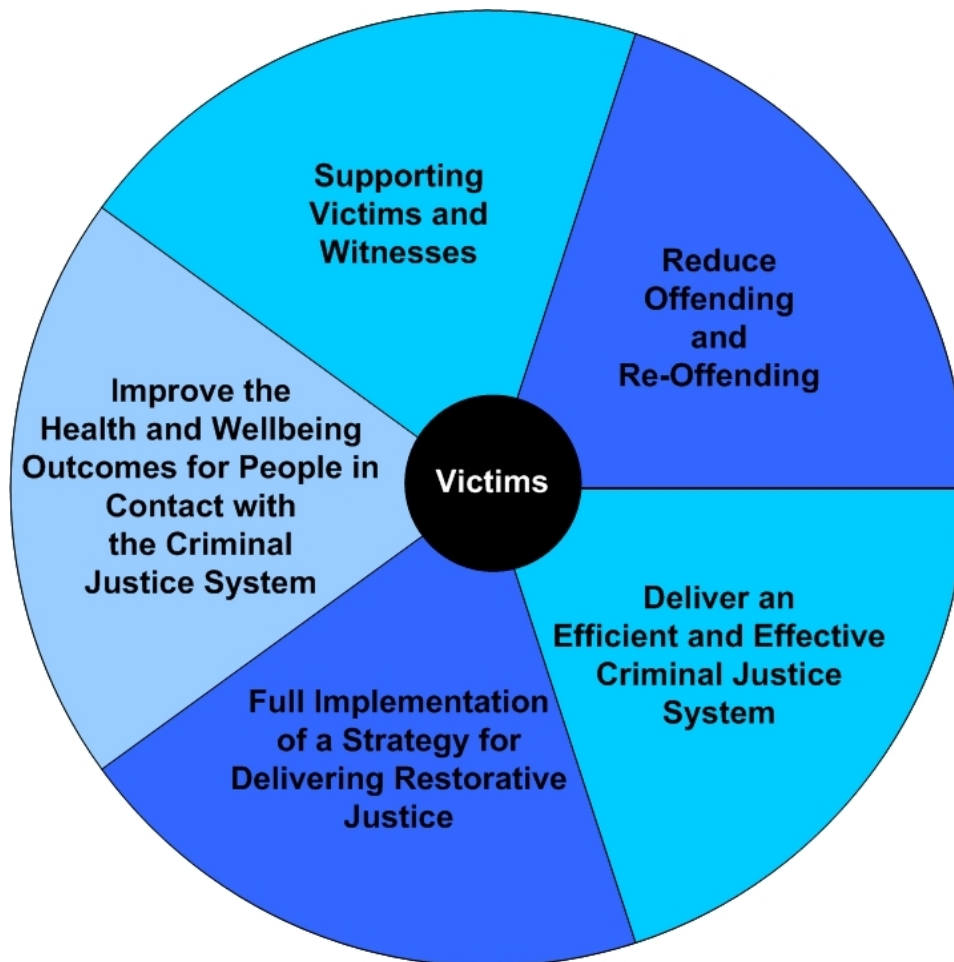




Surrey and Sussex Criminal Justice Partnerships Delivery Plan 2015-2017

Priorities

- **Supporting Victims and Witnesses.**
- **Full implementation of a strategy for delivering Restorative Justice.**
- **Deliver an Efficient and Effective Criminal Justice System.**
- **Reduce offending and re-offending.**
- **Improve the health and wellbeing outcomes for people in contact with the Criminal Justice System.**

1. Supporting Victims and Witnesses.

Key Deliverables:

- Provide enhanced support for the vulnerable, intimidated and those persistently targeted victims and witnesses with a particular emphasis on children and young people sensitive to the possibility of exploitation
- Provide a supportive environment for victims and witnesses who give their evidence remotely
- Better understand the victim journey from crime to court, with particular focus on victims of domestic abuse, ensuring they receive the right support at the right time.

2. Full implementation of a strategy for delivering Restorative Justice.

Key Deliverables:

- Open and accessible victim-led service
- Delivering multi-agency Restorative Justice hubs
- Accredited by Restorative Justice Council and achieving the Restorative Services Quality Mark (RSQM) (Youth in Surrey, Adult in Sussex).

3. Deliver an Efficient and Effective Criminal Justice System.

Key Deliverables:

- Ensure compliance with the CJS Efficiencies programme
- Ensure compliance with the Transforming Summary Justice programme
- Optimise video opportunities and agree a South East video strategy.

4. Reduce offending and re-offending.

Key Deliverables:

- Secure commitment to sustain our approach to reduce offending and re-offending
- Implement performance management framework (e.g. IDIOM) to firm up KPIs
- Develop a 'Through the Gate' partnership approach across probation services via a target operating model.

5. Improve the health and wellbeing outcomes for people in contact with the Criminal Justice System.

Key Deliverables:

- Commission comprehensive under 13 years CSA Examinations and aftercare for the populations of Surrey and Sussex
- Timely identification and assessment of health and wellbeing needs, and appropriate responses to meet those needs
- Embed effective partnership working and planning between prison, community health services and Community Rehabilitation Companies which enable appropriate health related interventions and support packages for offenders on release from prison.

Method

Each priority will be led by a Senior Responsible Officer, appointed by the SSCJP, who will be responsible for establishing an effective delivery framework supported by activity plans with key performance indicators to track progress.
